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Like so many beautiful folk songs, the origins of the melody for "Shenandoah" are long lost to the mists of time. The oldest references come from stories of traders who made their way west across North America in the early 19th century.

Above is Percy Grainger's 1905 transcription of the melody, made by listening to a retired boatman singing it as he had while working on a ship in the mid-1800s. The melody used for the current setting, though bearing much in common with this and other versions, is the one sung to the arranger as a child.

The song's original lyrics, many of which were successfully transcribed in the early 20th century, range from love songs for an Indian Chief's daughter, to raucous tales of deceit, thievery, and cultural destruction, to a simple longing for home. These old lyrics, which would certainly offend many modern sensibilities, were likely only an afterthought, with the song just one of many folk songs serving as a simple time-passing device for hard-working boatmen.

The text in the present setting is partially drawn from historically familiar lyrics, but rendered as a gentle call to an idyllic past, which recedes into the distance, across the river of time.
